## Inside the Park

Hello Neighbors,

As someone once said, "Spring is the time of plans and projects". Now that Spring is on the horizon, we would like to give everyone an update on planned and discussed projects for the neighborhood this year.

## **Approved Projects**

New Sub-division entrance signs: We have planned and approved removing the existing entrance signs on Lilley Rd and Saltz Rd and on Saltz Rd and Manton. There is a design rendering posted on the HOA Website and the HOA Facebook page. The new signs will be uniform in appearance, low maintenance and will help to enhance our neighborhood's overall image. The current signs are not uniform, require regular maintenance and are deteriorating.

<u>Park Entrance Signs</u>: We will continue with another park entrance sign replacement this year, the sign being replaced is for Winter Park at the Saltz entrance. This sign will mirror the other sign at the Walnut Ridge Entrance. All other sign areas that have not yet been replaced will have all the overgrown shrubs and weeds removed this spring, so that they are at least cleaner looking until they are replaced next year.

**Proposed Projects Pending Approval** 

<u>Volleyball Courts</u>: Proposed volleyball courts for Winter and Blue Mountain Parks. Poles and nets will be commercial grade exterior products. The nets are adjustable in height and the poles are galvanized steel and are removable for the winter months by having a sleeve encased in concrete in the ground.

<u>Play Structure</u>: A new play structure is being discussed to install either this year in late summer or early next spring. This structure will be installed in Blue Mountain Park and be meant for younger children, although it is rated for 2-12 years old.

#### **Miscellaneous**

**General Maintenance**: Also planned for this year is the trimming of some of the trees along Lilley Rd, to enhance the area and make it easier to walk down the sidewalks. New mulch and weed barrier at the Loveland Park play area. Painting of some of the playground equipment in each park. Removal of any dead trees in all parks. Installing netting in all 3 Pavilions to stop birds from nesting in the trusses.

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## Canton's New Local Road Program

Canton Township is now soliciting input from residents for repair projects to local public roads in our community.

Below are some questions and answers about this new program.

## What is the Local Road Repair Program?

The Canton Board of Trustees has designated approximately \$1.5M (30%) of the funds generated from



the road millage to repairs on local public roads. We are planning for local road projects for 2020 and beyond, and we are now soliciting project ideas from Homeowner Associations (HOAs) and other interested resident groups.

### What are we planning for 2019?

During 2019, Canton will use funds designated for local roads in selected areas throughout the community without requiring any participation or match from property owners. This work has been designated as unmatched work and will include preventative maintenance and selected drainage repairs throughout the community. The preventative maintenance work will occur throughout the community in 2019 and 2020. Drainage repairs will be focused north of Ford in 2019 and south of Ford in 2020. See the website for further details on this work.

How will the Local Road Program work in 2020? Starting in 2020 local road funding will be shifted towards matched work in residential subdivisions and on other residential roads. These projects may be sponsored by HOAs or other resident groups and will require contributions of matching funds from the group.

## EASTER EGG HUNT INSTRUCTIONS

It is the desire of your Board to make the egg hunt event fun and exciting for everyone who attends, fair to all children and inform participants ahead of time of the organization and expectations of the event.

## **COLORING CONTEST**

There are 3 age groups for the coloring contest; 3 to 5 years, 6 to 8 years and 9 to 11 years. Children under 3 cannot participate in contest.

Each age group has a **DESIGNATED** picture for them to color and each child can only enter **ONE** drawing. A copy of the picture can be found in your hard copy of the newsletter or online at the website. The coloring **MUST** be done ahead of the time of the event.

Meet at the picnic pavilion. Hunt areas have already been taped off and eggs "hidden" in the park, so please make sure your child **DOES NOT** pick any eggs up while walking to the pavilion. Any coloring contest pictures may be placed in a designated container for judging.

## EASTER EGG HUNT

There are four age groups for the Easter egg hunt: walking to 2 years, 3 to 5 years, 6 to 8 years and 9 to 11 years

In the walking to 2 years age group, **ONE** parent may be go with their child, parent cannot carry child but can help their child by holding hand while walking, carrying the basket and helping child in picking up egg and putting it in basket.

In age groups 3-5, 6-8 and 9-11, **ONLY** the participating child may be in the designated hunt area

There is only **ONE** golden egg per age group

There will be a **LIMIT** as to how many eggs each child can get (to be determined at time of hunt)

Only **ONE** age group at a time will hunt for eggs. All other groups must remain near pavilion until it is their turn. While one group is hunting their eggs, the winners of the coloring contest for the other age groups will receive their prizes and any child who did not win a prize can pick a participation prize.

When all groups are done with their egg hunt, prizes for the coloring contest and participation have been handed out, then the golden egg winner in each egg group will be given their prize.


### MARSHMALLOW DROP

There will be a marshmallow drop weather permitting after the egg hunt is done.

The plane will make two to three passes and drop marshmallows. There are four marshmallows that are colored. Only one colored marshmallow per child.

If a child gets one of the colored marshmallows, they may bring the marshmallow to the picnic pavilion to receive a prize.

The Board reserves the right to make any changes to these instructions as needed at the time of the hunt.




## AGE GROUP 3 - 5
